PERMIT CHICKENS AND QUAIL TO BE OWNED AND KEPT IN DRUMHELLER, THEY SHALL ABIDE BY BYLAWS DRAFTED IN REFERENCE TO OTHER CITIES WHO HAVE ALREADY DEVELOPED SUCH BYLAWS BUT ALTERED TO SUIT OUR COMMUNITY. WE WOULD SUGGEST A MAXIMUM OF 6 (SIX) CHICKENS OR 12 (TWELVE) QUAIL, OR A COMBINATION NOT EXCEEDING A MAXIMUM EQUIVALENT OF 6 CHICKENS IF 2 QUAIL ARE EQUAL TO 1 CHICKEN. PROHIBITED SALE OF THE EGGS OR MEAT OF THE BIRD (PERSONAL USE ONLY) (SLAUGHTERS MUST BE DONE BY A PROPERLY LICENCED FACILITY)


